

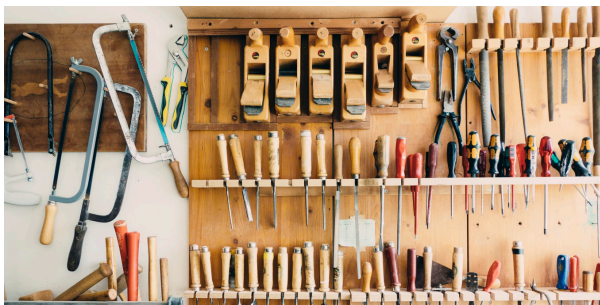
CPC20112 Certificate II in CONSTRUCTION

The construction, plumbing and allied trades industries offer a wide range of career opportunities from specific trades through to supervisory and management roles.

The industry covers the erection and installation of building components to form a structure for domestic living, business or enterprise.

General construction can involve low or high-rise commercial, industrial and/or residential buildings, carports and garages, including extensions, renovations or repairs and maintenance of buildings.

Depending on where you work, you may also have the opportunity to work on large concrete, steel and timber structures such as bridges, dams, power stations and civil engineering projects.



What will I gain from completing this course?

CPC20112 Certificate II in Construction covers many aspects of carpentry trade and is a perfect starting point for a career in the building and construction industry.

Certificate II in Construction is ideal for those who wish to build their practical experience and knowledge to ensure their employability as an apprentice carpenter.

This program covers the “hands-on” skills and knowledge required for carpentry at the entry level, including the safe use of most of the tools and equipment used by carpenters.

What will I learn?
