FROM THE SENIOR PRINCIPAL'S DESK

I am so thankful to God that the Senior Leadership were able to attend an amazing Schools Exposure trip in Melbourne. We were fortunate to visit six different schools: Mount Evelyn Christian School (A Christian School), Haileybury City Campus (Grammar School), Templestowe College (Government School), Salesian College Sunbury and Assumption College Kilmore (Catholic Schools). All of these schools offered something unique and future focused that we could experience and learn from.

As we look to the future of education and consider best practice for preparing our students for the future of work, our particular focus was on how we can deliver a personalised, innovative and engaging curriculum that inspires our students, encourages curiosity, engages their soul, and prepares them with confidence to navigate an uncertain future.

Our conversations were rich and it is exciting to be a part of a team who are daring to dream big and who are committed to exploring how high performing and future focused schools are engaging and inspiring students and teachers to achieve their very best.

Some of the feedback from the Senior Leadership Team:

- The importance that Christian Education remains the underpinning foundation in our School.
- That we review and elevate our Christian Living curriculum so we engage our students' hearts and minds in this subject area and build vibrant faith in our student body.
- One of the Schools described the Library as the epicentre of the School. In an age where technology is ubiquitous, it was great to see Libraries still thriving in very modern and progressive schools. The warm, inviting and well stocked Libraries beckoned for students to enter and discover new worlds, ideas, facts, information, and inspiration.
- Each school had overcome their own challenges to become thriving, creative and engaging communities of learners, preparing and equipping students to deal with the past, present and the future.
- Student and staff well-being was an important focus in many of the Schools. Personalised learning that caters for the interests, needs, gifts and abilities of all students can take many forms. Highly engaged students and authentic and meaningful learning is not dependent on a particular type of uniform, building, or fee structure. Indeed, rich learning experiences and high levels of achievement can be found in a variety of school settings.
- It provided an opportunity to establish networks with school leaders from other schools and sectors, and forge partnerships in best practice for progressive education.

- Seeing how other schools creatively use indoor and outdoor spaces provided insight into how we can creatively use our spaces here, to provide a welcoming and stimulating learning environment for our students.
- Visiting other schools allowed us as school leaders to imagine what best practice can look like for our School Community as we see the curriculum being taught and delivered in a variety of ways and in different school contexts.
- We can glean ideas that range from the simplest classroom layout and design through to re-thinking how we could embed some more innovative practices into our own school setting.
- It reinforced for me that there are good practices and ideas already employed in the Primary School, while also allowing me to see areas that we could address in future planning.
- It unites the Senior Leadership Team to a common purpose and vision in the School, allowing for robust, reflective conversations to be unpacked and discussed.

Seeing the sorts of programs, technology and resources schools have to be able to provide to their students. As well as how they use their facilities on the locations they are at to be able to give students varied opportunities, such as animal studies.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

At Leighland Christian School, we want our students to have opportunities to be able to reach their personal excellence and to flourish in their God given abilities and skills. When you walk around the School and see the things that students are doing, it is quite remarkable to see the talent of these young men and women. Whether that be in Art, Maths, Music, Science, History, whichever of our subjects, we see students who live out the gifts God has given them and will go on to do amazing things. The Bible tells us that each person is uniquely made, and so we each have things that we excel at, find easy or enjoyable. We also each have things that we find difficult and challenging and will at times need help with.

Sometimes it can be easy to focus on the negative, the things that we are not so good at or the failures we have experienced. It is good to reflect on our struggles and to learn from them, but it becomes unhealthy when this is the sole focus and the only aspect of learning that is given attention. When I was young I was involved in the Scouts, and now my son is also. One of the sayings of the Scouts is “DYB”, Do Your Best. It is a call that reminds us that the reality is we will never be the best at everything, that we will never be a master in everything. However, we may not be the best, but we can always do our best. That is, we can always work to our own personal excellence.

Personal excellence, after all, is not being the most excellent, but rather doing as excellent as you can in whatever you choose to do. And this is what we want our students to aspire to do in order to live out their full, God-given potential.

So how can our students do this, and how can we as parents and teachers encourage our students to do this? The key word there is encourage, to be able to positively support students to do their best, even if that means they fail. A teacher when I was at school used to say to me,

“you’ll never know unless you have a go”, you keep trying and growing. It also means being comforting when things do not go well, because no one likes to fail. A listening ear and a few comforting, genuine words can mean the difference between giving up and success for a lifetime.

At Leighland, our desire is to partner with families to be able to encourage our students to succeed and get the best education, so they can go on to have the best life they can. Ultimately, we want our students to be able to give glory to God and to use their skills to be able to love Him and to serve those around them. As the Apostle Paul writes in his letter to the Colossians:



Thank you to everyone who supported our fundraiser! Together we raised \$398.95 to help support those affected by the Ukrainian crisis.



NICHOLAS BROXAM

Nicholas (Year 9) was a member of an eight person Tasmanian squad selected on results and qualifying times to participate in the Australian Junior Track Nationals held at the Anna Meares Velodrome in Chandler, Brisbane from 24-27 March.

Nic rode as the third rider of the four person Under 17 Men's Pursuit Team which won Gold and claimed the title. He then combined with another rider from Hobart as the Tassie B Team in the Under 17 Men's Madison - a sixty lap race where working in teams of two, one person races whilst the other has a rest, riding slowly around the track to recover, then their racing partner slings the other back into the race. Every ten laps, they race for points. The last lap is worth double points. Nic and his partner were sitting in fourth place until the last lap where Nic got them over the line, picking up valuable points and awarding them with a Bronze medal.

Nic also had several personal bests in other events, making this a very successful and valuable experience, given that he has been selected in this team for the past three years but due to COVID-19, the 2020 and 2021 Championships for Juniors were cancelled.

Our Uniform Committee, which consists of the Senior Leadership Team and staff and parent representatives from both Campuses, meet once a Term.

Normal day to day uniform queries such as students being out of uniform or Uniform Shop enquiries are to be directed to the Teacher or School Office.

STUDENTS WHO ARE UNWELL

With the focus on Covid at the moment, it is easy to forget that we still have other illnesses circulating in the community. If your child has the common cold, please ensure you keep them at home until symptoms subside. If they have gastro, Public Health advises that children should not attend school or childcare until **at least 48 hours** after the symptoms have stopped. By abiding by these recommendations, it helps keep illnesses in our School community to a minimum. We appreciate your cooperation!

We also remind parents that students should not be given medication to bring to school (including Paracetamol). If your child requires medication during school hours, please drop it in to the Office and leave it with our friendly Admin staff, along with clear instructions. 
